These wānanga were well attended, and whānau become further engaged.

This identified the need for grass roots, by Māori for Māori approach

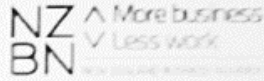

Ara Rau Tangata

Our origins began as a group of Tangata Whenua alongside agency representatives from the 3 local authorities in Tauranga, Te Puni Kōkiri alongside others that were committed to supporting Māori Land Trust to development of whenua Māori.



At the moment, our offerings are largely event (wānanga based). What we have seen is that there is a need to be accessible to our whanau outside of these offerings. Our governance board is functioning as an operations team, but the scale of demand is now exceeding the time capacity they have. This will continue to grow as this Kaupapa matures. The time has come for us to employ an operational FTE to further develop the Kaupapa and establish a physical point in which whānau can drop into.



We are seeking funding support for this next stage of our development. Eventually we wish to be completely self sufficient however, until we have a sufficient general manager in place to drive these initiatives and set up our infrastructure we are constrained.

Ngā Mātāpono

Our guiding principles are:

- He Oranga Tāngata - pathways of wellbeing

- He Oranga Whenua - the protection of our traditional water resources (i.e. moana, tāhuna, awa & roto), heritage sites and cultural landscapes and other taonga of importance.

- He Oranga Kāinga - access to affordable intergeneration, healthy, dry, warm, safe, durable and sustainable housing in a whānau environment on their whenua.

- Ka Ora e - collectively we will thrive and prosper on our whenua.



Ngā Mātāpono | Guiding principles **He oranga tāngata**

He oranga tāngata describes pathways of wellbeing.

Housing is a significant factor for our health and social wellbeing. We are more likely to be affected by overcrowding, substandard housing and low levels of home ownership.

Ara Rau Tangata sets out an approach for improving housing for Māori and their whānau and growing the Māori housing sector so that Māori have more choice.

It aims to empower whānau to better manage their own futures and sets out how central government and local government will support Māori communities.

He oranga tangata; our communities are built on a mix of kaumātua (koroua & kuia), pakeke, mātua, tamariki, mokopuna who live, work and care for one-another;

- Whānau members drive our focus for workshops, wānanga, conferences, expo, events etc ...
- Develop and maintain key partner relationships with:
 - Whānau membership including our Māori Land Trusts, Marae and Hapū
 - Māori Land Court, Te Puni Kokiri, Māori Trustee;

 - Local opportunities: Bay Trust, Social Link and others;

Trustees driving/guardians: Arthur, & Julie.

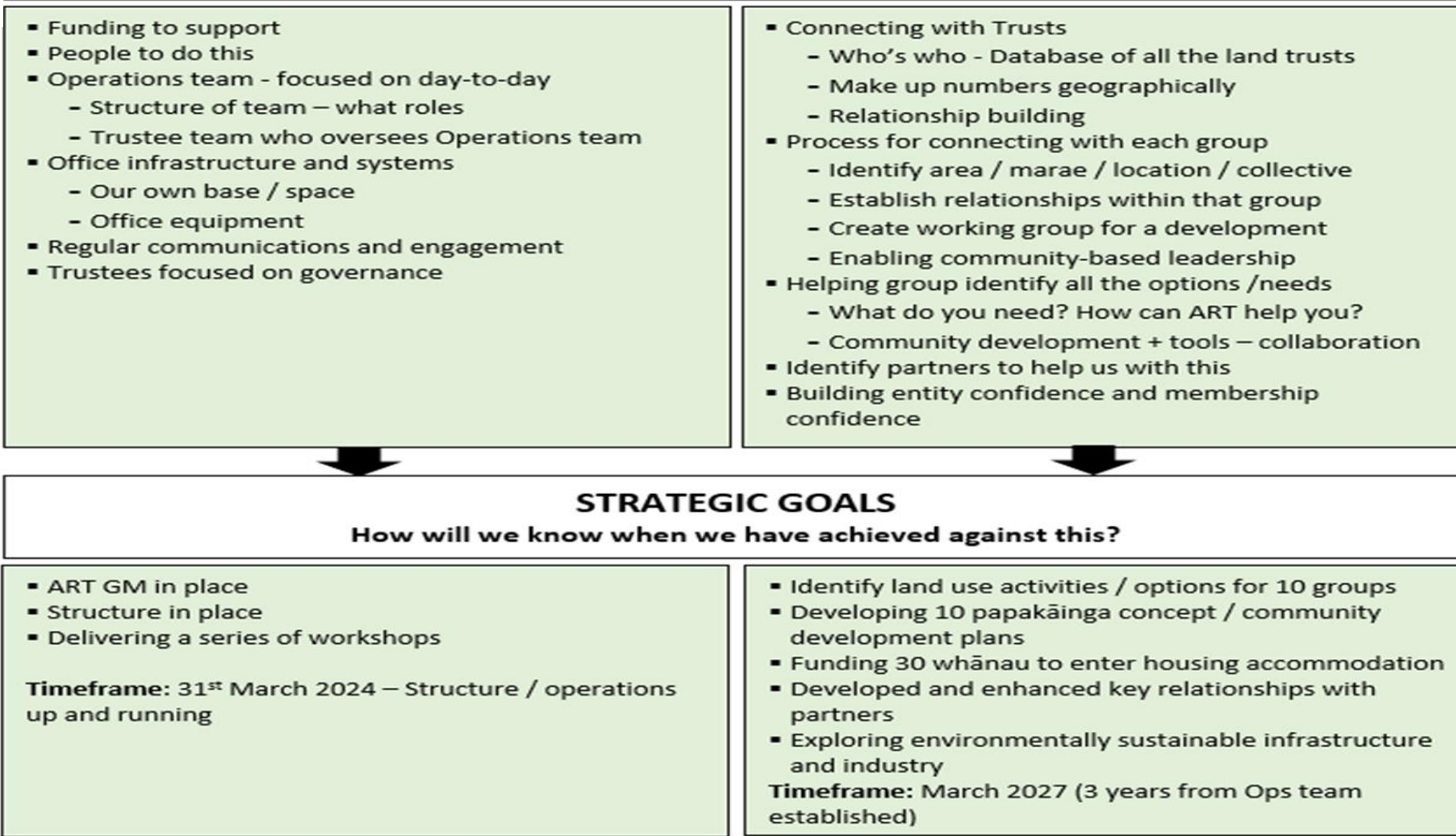
