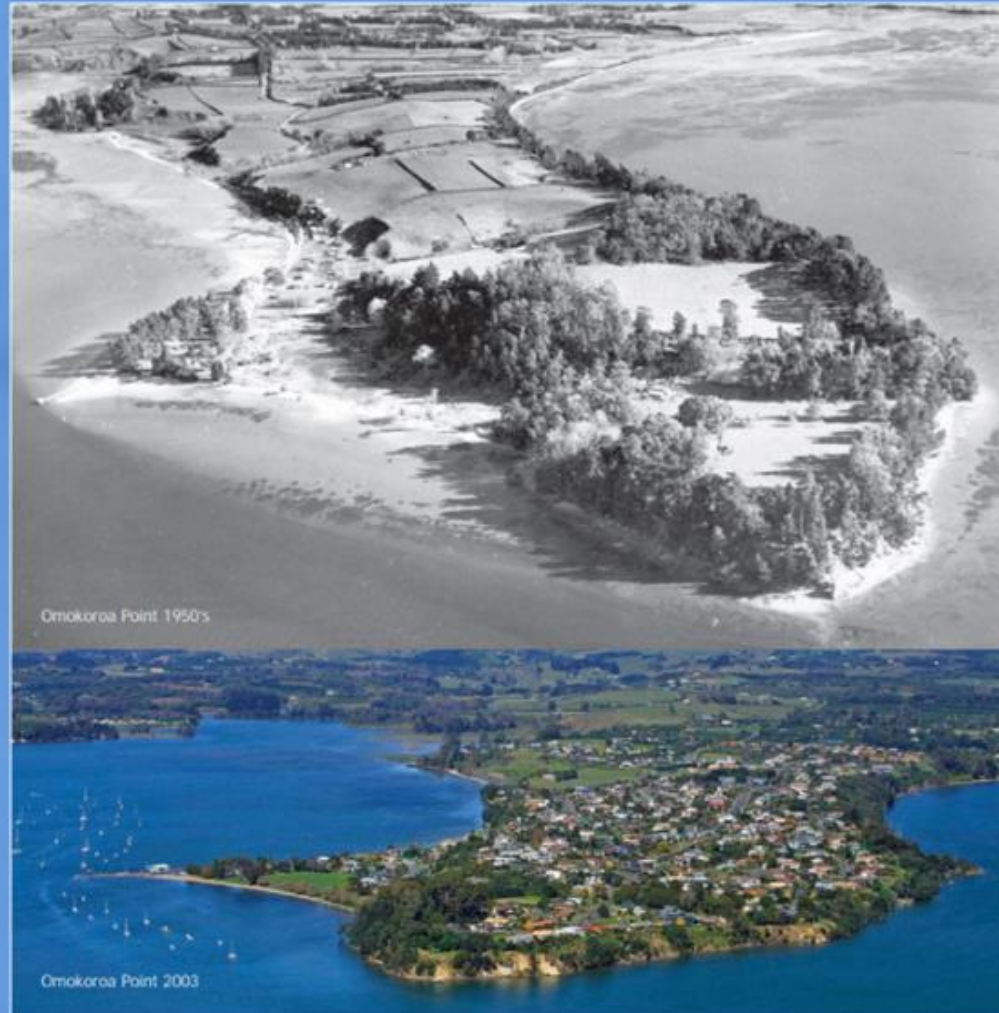
Earthworks

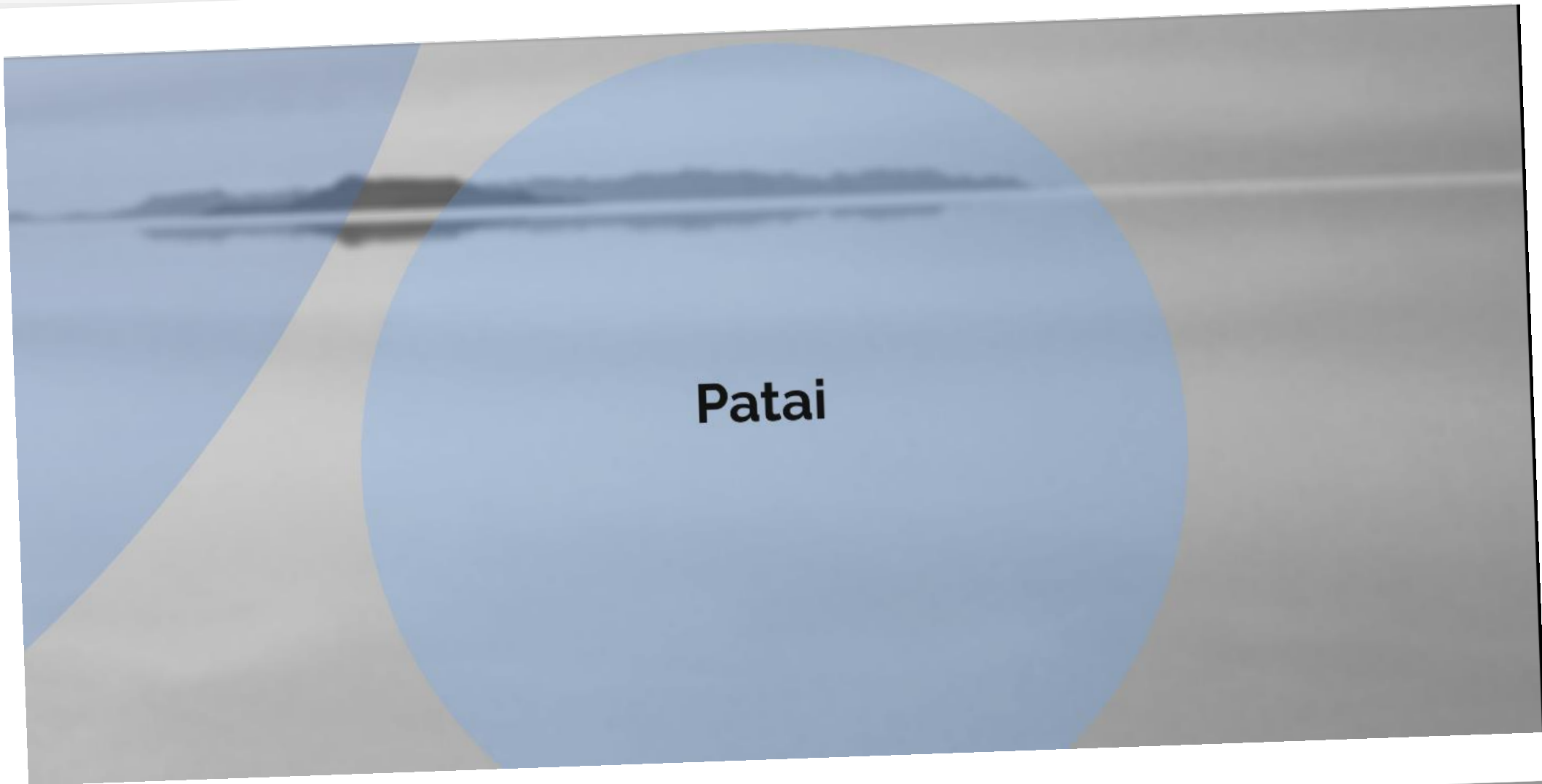
